
## **HOLIDAYS**



## Down:

- 1. ......'s Day is celebrated in the USA on the second Sunday in May. A similar holiday in Russia is celebrated on the 8<sup>th</sup> of March.
- 2. The Queen's Official ...... is celebrated in the UK on the first, second, or third Saturday in June and is marked in London by the ceremony of Trooping the Colour.
- 3. ...... Day is the Birthday of the United States. It is celebrated on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.
- 4. ...... Day is celebrated in the USA on the 4th Thursday in November. It was first celebrated in 1621 by settlers in Plymouth colony to give thanks for their first harvest.
- 5. All ....... Day is celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> of November. It is the day to honour dead family members.
- 6. ...... is celebrated in the 31<sup>st</sup> of October. It is the day when children dress up and go to neighbors for sweets, trick or treat.

- 7. ...... Day is celebrated in the UK on the Sunday closest to the 11<sup>th</sup> of November: It honours the dead of all wars.
- 8. ..... is the Scottish name for the last day of the year.
- 9. April ...... 's Day is celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> of April. It is the day when people play tricks on each other.
- 10. Martin Luther ....... Day is celebrated in the USA on the third Monday in January. It commemorates the famous Civil Rights leader.

## Across:

- 1. ....... Day is celebrated in the USA on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in October. It commemorates the discovery of the new continent by the famous explorer in 1492.
- 2. ...... Day is celebrated on the 26<sup>th</sup> of December. Traditionally it was the day when wealthy people in the UK would give a gift to their servants.
- 3. ......'s Day is celebrated in the USA on the 11<sup>th</sup> of November. It is the anniversary of the signing of the armistice, which ended the World War I. Nowadays it honours all military personnel who served the United States in all wars.
- 4. ...... Day is celebrated in the USA on the last Monday in May. It is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving in the US Armed Forces.
- 5. ...... Day is observed in the USA on the first Monday in September. It honours workers and is also celebrated as the symbolic end of the summer.
- 6. ..... commemorates the resurrection of Jesus. It is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon in spring:
- 7. .....'s Day is celebrated on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in June. It is a celebration in honour of the male parent.
- 8. St. ......'s Day is the Day of lovers, celebrated on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February
- 9. Guy ....... Night is celebrated on the 5tyh of November. It remembers the execution of the man who tried to blow the Houses of Parliament in 1605.
- 10. ...... Tuesday marks the end of the carnival season before Lent. It is sometimes called Pancake Tuesday.
- 11. ...... Day celebrates the birth of Jesus. It is celebrated on the 25<sup>th</sup> of December.
- 12. ...... Year's Day is celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January.
- 13. ..... Day is celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May in the UK. It honours labour.
- 14. St. .......'s Day is celebrated on the 17<sup>th</sup> of March. It honours the patron saint of Ireland.
- 15. ...... Day is celebrated in the USA on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of February. On that day people observe the behaviour of a marmot waking from its winter sleep and make predictions about the weather.
